Horse therapy helps amazing youth overcome physical and emotional abuse, violence, and other crisis that make it difficult for them to trust anyone, let alone succeed in life.

This is the essence of what we do at Janice Faye's Ranch. The equine work helps clients work through relational issues, learning new patterns of thinking, finding one's self-worth and confidence and practicing clear and better ways to communicate. The ranch tutors help clients one-on-one with any educational difficulties they may have. By creating new patterns in relationships, it is our hope to assist youth and those in crisis make better choices as they face the pressures of today's society and break any patterns of abuse.



The Equine-assisted social skill building program at the ranch is an 8-12 week program. Certified Equine Specialists partner rescued horses with participants to develop, practice and master pro-social skills including interpersonal, problem solving, anger management, academic enhancement, vocational development and other life skills to

reduce unacceptable behaviors and empower pro-social peer relationships.



After beginning the program, participants show an increase in confidence levels and teamwork skills within months. Survey and assessments are conducted before and after sessions using Pony Tracker software and the ranch's check-in/check-out survey. The ranch tutors, guidance counselors and teachers work together to ensure the child's educational progression. Students participating in the tutoring program usually show an increase of 2-3.5% in their GPA before the next school semester.
